DAY 5: More Chicago sights are included this morning, followed by time to shop and stroll on the **Magnificent Mile**, the avenue lined with glittering department stores and boutiques. FLORIDA AND THE KEYS

January 20 - February 2, 2014

DAY 1: Sunshine, warm weather, theme parks, coastline and no snow. Sounds like we might be heading south to Florida and the Keys! We get acquainted with fellow travelers on our way to poet Carl Sandburg's hometown. Overnight - Galesburg, IL

DAY 2: Prairies change to rolling hills and valleys as we make our way to Kentucky, land of Daniel Boone, bourbon, tobacco and thoroughbreds. In Louisville we have an Inside the Gates Tour at Churchill Downs. Royalty, celebrities and local fans have entered these same gates under the Twin Spires. We will learn about the glitz and glamour of horseracing from Millionaires Row and get a horseman's perspective from the paddock where every Derby winner has saddled up. Along the way there will be beautiful artwork, fascinating artifacts and possibly a legend or two roaming the halls of this famous racetrack.

Overnight - Elizabethtown, KY (B)

DAY 3: Leaving Kentucky, a border state during the Civil War, we cross into Tennessee, the last state to secede from the Union. At Stones River National Battlefield, we re-live one of the bloodiest and most important battles of the war. The Union victory, bought at a high price, forever changed the people who lived and fought there. We continue into the Peach State of Georgia for our stay tonight. Overnight - Locust Grove, GA (B)

DAY 4: Georgia is the #1 producer of pecans in the world, and a morning stop gives us a chance to purchase the local produce. A good welcome to Florida, the Sunshine State, is a taste of fresh orange or grapefruit juice. After driving through the agricultural and thoroughbred country of central Florida, we head to the Gulf of Mexico and our stay at a beachfront hotel.

Overnight - Clearwater Beach, FL (B)

DAY 5: We continue down the west side of Florida to Fort Myers, a city with more than 70 varieties of palms. At Manatee Park we look for these slow moving, curious marine mammals sometimes known as "sea cows." Thomas Edison and Henry Ford purchased adjoining properties in Florida. Our visit to the Edison and Ford Winter Estates includes their homes, a botanical garden, Edison's laboratory and a museum with inventions and artifacts. Overnight -**Bonita Springs**, FL

DAY 6: Southern Florida is a unique flat wetlands with saw grass, cypress, mangrove, alligators, birds and other wildlife. On our Airboat Tour of the Everglades, our captains take us on an exciting ride through the mangrove corridor. Visitor Centers and walking trails in Everglades National Park give us more opportunities to look for alligators and to learn about this threatened ecosystem. Overnight - Florida City, FL (B)

DAY 7: We leave Florida's mainland and begin our drive down the 125-mile stretch of islands known as the **Florida Keys**. Of the 1,700 islands in the chain, Key West is the most popular and well known. The educational and entertaining **Key West Conch Tour Train** takes us around this southern-most city in the United States, with its Bahamian-style architecture and Caribbean influence. During our free time we can sample conch chowder or some delicious Key Lime Pie. Overnight - **Florida City, FL (B)**

DAY 8: On the east coast of Florida, we find Fort Lauderdale, known as the "Venice of America" because of its extensive canal system. On our **Fort Lauderdale Sightseeing Cruise** we pass lavish multi-million-dollar homes and huge yachts that give the city another title: "Yachting Capital of the World." Our drive continues north and then inland to the Orlando area, one of the most popular tourist destinations in the United States. Overnight - **Orlando**, **FL (B)**

DAY 9: Traveling east of Orlando, we reach Merritt Island and the **Kennedy Space Center Visitor Complex**. Our visit will include a bus tour of the Space Center, IMAX movies and the Rocket Garden where we can stand under rockets that put astronauts into space. We will be able to encounter an astronaut, view lunar modules and space suits, touch a moon rock and see the Astronauts Memorial Space Mirror, dedicated to American astronauts who died in the line of duty. Overnight - **Orlando, FL (B)**

DAY 10: Today we have choices to make. Transportation will be provided to SeaWorld and Walt Disney World, or we can choose to relax around the pool. Overnight - **Orlando, FL (B)**

DAY 11: Reluctantly leaving Central Florida, we drive north to Plains, GA. At the **Jimmy Carter National Historic Site** we will visit the Boyhood Farm, the restored former Plains High School, now a visitor center and museum, and drive by brother Billy's service station. Our stay tonight is in a Victorian style hotel in the historic area of Americus. Overnight - Americus, GA (B)

DAY 12: A relaxing drive brings us through Georgia and into Tennessee, a state that has contributed to several music styles. Nashville is considered the home of the country music recording industry. Tonight at the **Grand Ole Opry**, we hear performances by both country music legends and contemporary stars. Overnight - **Nashville**, **TN** (**B**)

DAY 13: Travel today brings us into St. Louis, MO where we visit the **Gateway Arch**, tallest stainless steel monument in the world. Choices include either the tram ride to the top or an IMAX movie. Overnight - **Canton**, **MO** (**B**)

DAY 14: After our time in the Sunshine State, winter will seem almost cut in half. We will long remember the warmer temperatures, beautiful scenery and, most of all, the wonderful new friends we have made. **(B)**



Accurately restored, this was the largest stern-wheeled riverboat on the Yukon. Tonight the Frantic Follies provides vaudeville entertainment typical of the gold rush era. Overnight - Whitehorse, YT

DAY 5: Our drive today is on the Alaska Highway, the road carved through the wilderness in 1942 at an average rate of 10 newly constructed miles each day. We will find the road is now a paved highway and a grand adventure. Stops will be made at the **First Nation Cultural Centre, Sheep Mountain Visitor Centre** and the **Tetlin National Wildlife Refuge** before our stay tonight in Tok, a town that did not exist until the Alaska Highway was built and where they have two seasons: winter is here, and winter is coming. Overnight - **Tok, AK**

DAY 6: A full day of sightseeing begins with a drive through farming country in Delta Junction. Just outside of Fairbanks, we walk under the Alaska Pipeline, ride a replica of the Tanana Valley Railroad and get a crash course in mining at **Gold Dredge No. 8**. Then it's time to try our hand at panning for gold. Whatever we find, we get to keep! We continue to the **Morris Thompson Cultural and Visitor Center**. The day ends with a delicious **Alaska Salmon Bake**. Overnight - **Fairbanks, AK (D)**



DAY 7: On our morning Riverboat Discovery Cruise we will see elegant riverfront log homes, pass by the famous Cripple Creek of gold rush fame and stop at Old Chena Indian village where Alaskan natives share their culture. After a stop at Santa Claus House, we drive to Denali National Park and our hotel for the next two nights. Overnight - **Denali Park**, **AK**






DAY 1: Saddling a horse is not necessary this morning. Instead we board our luxury motorcoach and begin a comfortable ride to the Calgary Stampede. Overnight - **Minot**, **ND**

All Transportation arrangements made for Your evacuation must be by the most direct and economical route possible. Expenses for Special Transportation must be: a) recommended by the attending Physician; b) required by the standard regulations of the conveyance transporting You; AND c) verified, approved, and arranged in advance by On Call International.

Transportation means any land, water, or air conveyance required to transport You during an Emergency Evacuation. *Special Transportation* includes, but is not limited to, air ambulances, land ambulances, and private motor vehicles.

Additional Covered Expenses: If You are hospitalized for more than seven days following an Emergency Evacuation, benefits will be paid: (a) to return Your accompanying dependent children under age 25 to their home, limited to the cost of one-way economy airfare, less the value



of applied credit from an unused return travel ticket, with an attendant if necessary; and/or (b) up to the cost of round-trip economy airfare to bring a person chosen by You to and from Your bedside if You are alone. These expenses must be authorized in advance by On Call International. Benefits will not be paid for expenses provided by another party at no cost to You or already included in the cost of the Trip.

Repatriation of Remains means the cost, according to airline tariffs, of the shipment of Your deceased body to the point of origin shown on the original travel tickets. *Eligible Expenses* include, but are not limited to, expenses for embalming, cremation, coffin for repatriation, and Transportation.

Note: In no event will Eligible Expenses for Emergency Evacuation/ Repatriation of Remains exceed the amount listed in the Schedule of Benefits.

Accident & Sickness Medical Expense

Benefits will be paid, up to \$10,000 per person (\$20,000 for Enhanced Plan), if You incur necessary Eligible Medical Expenses as a result of an Injury, or as a result of Sickness, occurring while on Your Trip. The accident causing such Injury must occur while You are covered under the plan, and the Sickness must first occur during Your Trip. You must receive initial treatment within ninety (90) days of the accident which caused the Injury or the onset of the Sickness. All services, supplies, or treatment must be received within fifty two (52) weeks of the date of the accident or the onset of the Sickness.

Eligible Medical Expenses are necessary services and supplies which are recommended by the attending Physician. They include the services of a legally qualified Physician, surgeon, graduate nurse, dentist, or osteopath; charges for hospital confinement and use of operating rooms; charges for anesthetics (including administration, x-ray examinations or treatments, and laboratory tests); ambulance service; drugs, medicines, and therapeutic services and supplies. Benefits are not paid in excess of the reasonable and customary charges commonly used by providers of medical care in the locality in which the care is furnished.

Important: Benefits are subject to the Pre-Existing Condition Exclusion detailed below and other exclusions listed on Page 7.

Pre-Existing Conditions

Benefits will not be paid under Parts A & B (except Emergency Evacuation and Repatriation of Remains) for any claims arising from any Injury, Sickness, or other condition affecting You, a Traveling Companion, or an Immediate Family member booked to travel with You which, within the 60-day period before Your Trip Cancellation Benefits began under this plan: (a) first manifested itself, became acute, or had symptoms which would prompt a reasonable person to seek diagnosis, care, or treatment; (b) required taking prescribed drugs or medicine, unless the condition for which the prescribed drug or medicine was taken remained controlled without any change in the required prescription; or (c) required treatment or treatment was recommended by a Physician.

We will WAIVE the above Pre-Existing Condition exclusion if:

- (1) You purchase the Enhanced Plan (see Page 10),
- (2) Your enrollment form is postmarked or Your phone sale completed within fourteen (14) days of the date You make deposit or initial payment for Your Trip, AND
- (3) You purchase coverage for the full cost of Your Trip.

Satisfaction of this prerequisite will be verified during claim processing.



Part C. Baggage Protection

Baggage/Personal Effects

Benefits will be paid, up to \$1,500, for loss, theft, or damage to Your baggage and/or personal effects occurring during Your Trip. Benefits will be paid for the lesser of the following: original cash value of the item less depreciation as determined by the Administrator; or cost of repair or replacement. The maximum benefit per article is \$250. There will be a combined maximum limit of \$500 for the following: jewelry; watches; articles consisting in whole or in part of silver, gold, or platinum; furs, articles trimmed with or made mostly of fur; and cameras and their related equipment.

Baggage Delay

You will be reimbursed for expenses of necessary personal effects, up to \$500, if Your checked baggage is delayed or misdirected by a Common Carrier for more than 24 hours from the time You arrived at the destination stated on Your ticket. You must be a ticketed passenger on a Common Carrier.

Excess Insurance Provision

The benefits provided under Parts A, B, and C shall be in excess of all other valid and collectible insurance or indemnity and shall apply only when such other benefits are exhausted. Recovery of losses under Parts A, B, & C from other parties does not result in a refund of your plan cost.



Part D. Worldwide Emergency Assistance (On Call International)

On Call International provides a 24-hour emergency telephone assistance service for Your benefit so that, in the event of an emergency during the term of these benefits, English-speaking help and advice may be furnished. Services may include:

- Pre-Trip Health, Safety, & Weather Information
- Travel Changes
- Lost Luggage Assistance
- Emergency Cash Transfer Assistance
- Medical Consultation and Monitoring
- Emergency Legal Assistance
- Coordination of Medical Payments
- Lost Travel Documents Assistance

*If You have any difficulty making this collect call, contact the local phone operator to connect You to a U.S.-based, long-distance service. In this case, please let the Assistance Provider answering the phone know the number You are calling from, so that he/she may call You back. Any charges for the call will be considered reimbursable benefits.

Travel assistance services are provided by an independent organization and not by United States Fire Insurance Company or BerkelyCare. There may be times when circumstances beyond On Call's control hinder their endeavors to provide travel assistance services. They will, however, make all reasonable efforts to provide travel assistance services and help You resolve Your emergency situation. In all cases, You are still responsible for obtaining, using, and paying for Your own required services of all types.





Part E. Optional Flight Benefit

(applies only if additional cost has been paid)

Accidental Death & Dismemberment:

If you sustain an Injury (1) while as a passenger in, on, boarding, or while alighting from an air conveyance organized and licensed for the transportation of passengers for hire; or (2) being struck or run down by an aircraft which results in death or loss of limb, eyesight, speech, or hearing within 365 days of the date of the accident; benefits will be paid for the largest applicable amount shown as follows: the benefit amount shown in the Schedule of Benefits and Services for death, loss of speech and hearing in both ears, or loss of any combination of two hands, feet, or eyes; one-half the benefit amount for loss of any one of these; and one-quarter the benefit amount for loss of thumb and index finger of the same hand. Loss of hand or hands, or foot or feet, means severance at or above the wrist joint or ankle joint, respectively. Loss of eye or eyes means the total and irrecoverable loss of the entire sight thereof. In no event will benefits be paid more than the maximum benefit \$300,000.

Beneficiary: Your estate, unless notice of designated beneficiary is provided to BerkelyCare.

Definitions

- 1. "Business Partner" means an individual who is: (a) involved with You in a legal partnership; and (b) actively involved in the day-to-day management of the business.
- 2. "Common Carrier" means an air, land, or sea conveyance operating under a valid license for the transportation of passengers for hire.
- 3. "Domestic Partner" means a person who is at least eighteen years of age and You can show: 1) evidence of financial interdependence, such as joint bank accounts or credit cards, jointly owned property, and mutual life insurance or pension beneficiary designations; 2) evidence of continuous cohabitation throughout the 180-day period prior to the Effective Date of Your Plan; and 3) an Affidavit of Domestic Partnership if recognized by the jurisdiction within which they reside.
- "Financial Insolvency" means a Travel Supplier has ceased operations, either filing a petition for bankruptcy or as a result of a denial of credit or inability to meet financial obligations.
- 5. "Immediate Family" means children, children-in-law, step- or adopted children, parents, parents-in-law, step-parents, siblings, siblings-in-law, step-siblings, grandparents, grandchildren, legal or common law spouse (including Domestic Partner), aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, or a Business Partner of You or Your Traveling Companion.
- 6. "Injury" means bodily Injury caused by an accident occurring while this plan is in force and resulting directly and independently of all other causes in loss covered by this plan. The Injury must be verified by a Physician.
- 7. "Land/Sea Arrangements" means land and/or sea arrangements made by and paid to Your NTA Member Tour Operator.
- 8. "NTA Member Tour Operator" means a tour operator in good standing with the National Tour Association.
- "Physician" means a licensed practitioner of the healing arts acting within the scope of his/her license. The treating Physician may not be You, a Traveling Companion, or an Immediate Family member.
- "Sickness" means an illness or disease which is diagnosed or treated by a Physician after the effective date of benefits and while You are eligible for this plan.
- 11. "Travel Supplier" means a tour operator, motorcoach operator, cruise line, and/or airline with whom Your NTA Member Tour Operator has contracted to provide prepaid travel arrangements for Your Trip. The Travel Supplier may not be Your NTA Member Tour Operator.
- 12. "Traveling Companion" means one person booked to accompany You on Your Trip. NOTE: A group or tour leader is not considered a

Traveling Companion unless you are sharing room accommodations with the group or tour leader.

- 13. "Trip" means Land/Sea Arrangements prepaid to Your NTA Tour Operator Member and shall include flight connections to join and depart such Land/Sea Arrangements provided that the cost of any arrangements not arranged by and prepaid to Your NTA Tour Operator Member has been included in the total Trip cost for purposes of determining the applicable plan cost.
- 14. "You" or "Your" means a person who has purchased a Trip and who has paid the required plan cost for the benefits provided hereunder.

Claims Procedure

EMERGENCIES ARISING DURING YOUR TRIP: For emergencies requiring evacuation or interruption of Your Trip, call On Call International immediately at the numbers listed on Page 5. Identify yourself as an NTA Protection Plan purchaser and give the details of Your problem or medical emergency. TRIP CANCELLATION CLAIMS: Contact Your NTA Member Tour Operator and BerkelyCare IMMEDIATELY to notify them of Your cancellation and to avoid any non-covered expenses due to late reporting. Cancellations due to Financial Insolvency require copies of correspondence with Your credit card company regarding any reimbursement received or denied by Your credit card provider. You will then be forwarded the appropriate claim form which must be completed by You AND THE ATTENDING PHYSICIAN, if applicable.

ALL OTHER CLAIMS: Please call or report Your claim as soon as possible to BerkelyCare. Identify yourself as a purchaser of the NTA Protection Plan, and provide Your confirmation number, Your travel dates, and details describing the nature of Your loss. Upon receipt of this information, You will promptly be forwarded the appropriate claim form to complete.

IMPORTANT: In order to facilitate prompt claims settlement upon Your return, be sure to obtain as applicable: detailed medical statements from Physicians in attendance where the accident or Sickness occurred; receipts for medical services and supplies; receipts from the hospital; or police reports or claims reports from parties responsible (e.g., airline, hotel, etc.) for loss, theft, damage, or delay. In the event of a baggage claim, receipts for any lost or damaged items will be required. In the event of a Baggage Delay or a Trip Delay claim, receipts for any additional expenses will be required, as well as verification of the delay.

Notice to Residents of Florida: The benefits of this Protection Plan are governed primarily by the laws of a state other than Florida. Your homeowners policy, if any, may provide coverage for loss of personal effects provided by the Baggage and Personal Effects benefits. This insurance is not required in connection with the purchase of Your travel arrangements.

Notice to Residents of California: This Protection Plan contains disability insurance or health insurance benefits, or both, that only apply during the Trip. Because You may have coverage from other sources that already provide You with these benefits, You should review Your existing policies. If You have any questions about Your current coverage, call Your insurer or health plan. The Pre-Existing Condition limitation is waived for Medical Expenses.

PHONE RESERVATIONS:

Reservations made by phone will be held

up to three days, pending receipt of your deposit.

DEPOSITS:

Deposits for extended motorcoach tours are \$200.00 per person unless stated otherwise.

PAYMENTS:

Cash, personal check, Mastercard, VISA, Discover or money order will be accepted for payment on motorcoach tours. Due to customer requests and the increasing costs to process credit cards, we have changed the way we price our tours. You now can take advantage of cash discount pricing when you pay for your tour with cash, check or cashiers check. (Your deposit and final payment must be paid in the same form of payment to qualify.) We will still gladly accept your Visa, Mastercard, or Discover card. These will just not qualify for the cash discount policy.

FINAL PAYMENTS:

Your reservation confirmation will indicate the due date for final payment. No further notice will be issued or sent.

CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS:

You may cancel your motorcoach reservation for any reason thirty days prior to departure and receive 100% refund based on monies recoverable by Southwest Tour and Travel. Tours with airfare, cruises or other special arrangements have specified refund policies.

TRIP CANCELLATION INSURANCE:

Coverage can protect you from nonrefundable charges and possible additional expenses, should illness or accident make it necessary for you or your traveling companion to cancel your tour or leave the tour enroute. You may purchase this insurance from Southwest Tour and Travel or your local travel agency.

INCLUSIONS:

Your tour price includes motorcoach and other modes of transportation if indicated in individual itineraries, hotel accommodations, sightseeing and admissions to attractions designated on itinerary, meals as indicated, baggage handling for one large bag as indicated, services of a professional Southwest Tour and Travel Director and Driver. Meals on tours are listed at the end of each day with the letters B (Breakfast), L (Lunch), D (Dinner), and on some tours Complimentary Beverages (CB). Taxes and tips on included features and meals where indicated are also included.

TOUR DOCUMENTS:

All necessary information will be sent to you approximately 10 days prior to departure. This will include an itinerary, your departure time and place, hotel listing, luggage tag and medical form.

ROOM SHARING ARRANGEMENTS:

Tour participants not wishing to travel alone may request a traveling companion. Please indicate your desire to share accommodations when making your reservations, and Southwest Tour and Travel will make every effort to find you a roommate. In the event a suitable roommate cannot be found, the single rate will apply. Please understand that a "single" reservation means single accommodations at the hotels, and does not guarantee a double seat on the motorcoach. Please be advised that triple and quad accommodations at the hotels will be two beds only. It does not cover the cost of a rollaway.

CHANGES IN ACCOMMODATIONS:

If you are sharing a room and your partner cancels or leaves the tour en-route, you will be responsible for the difference in the accommodation cost.

ITINERARY VARIATIONS:

Tours are planned a year or more in advance. Between planning time and actual tour operation, our Operations Department constantly strives to improve each itinerary to add to your convenience and enjoyment. If improvements can be made or if unforeseen conditions beyond our control deem change necessary, we reserve the right to vary itineraries and substitute facilities or attractions of equivalent or better value. In the event of cancellation of any scheduled attraction for any cause, we will attempt to provide a suitable substitute.

GRATUITIES:

Unless otherwise stated, all tips for services rendered are paid by Southwest Tour and Travel. Gratuities for your tour director and driver are not included. They should always be related to the service received, and your personal discretion is advised. \$2-\$3 per day for the tour director and \$2-\$3 per day for the driver is the suggested amount per person. While on tour, it is important to remember to

tip for coffee breaks and meals which you are buying for yourself and not included in the cost of the tour.

LUGGAGE:

Each person is allowed one large suitcase (max. 70 lbs.) which will be handled for you throughout the tour as indicated. In addition, a small overnight case or tote bag may be carried aboard. Carry-on articles are the responsibility of each person. Most airlines now charge for each checked bag. This fee is not included in the tour price and is paid at the airport at check-in. Though every effort will be made to safeguard your luggage, Southwest Tour and Travel accepts no liability for loss or damage of luggage. Report any damage at the time it happens.

DEPARTURE POINTS:

All extended tours originate at designated Southwest Tour and Travel locations: Marshall, Willmar, Luverne, Worthington, Jackson, Fairmont, Sioux Falls and Brookings. Additional pickup points are scheduled based on the tour routing. Courtesy shuttle transportation will be provided upon request for ten or more people departing from the same location on most motorcoach tours. Some exceptions may apply.

SMOKING/LIQUOR:

No smoking, chewing tobacco or open liquor is allowed on the motorcoach. Frequent stops are made, at which time those who wish to smoke may do so. Southwest Tour and Travel reserves the right to not transport a person or persons under the influence of intoxicating liquor or drugs, or who is incapable of taking care of himself/herself, or whose conduct is such or is likely to be such as to make him/her objectionable to either a Southwest Tours' employee or fellow passenger. This rule does not apply to persons who are ill and accompanied by an attendant or nurse. The final decision regarding this policy will be determined by Southwest Tour and Travel management. It will be the responsibility of the passenger denied boarding to furnish transportation back to his/her original boarding location.

SEATING ARRANGEMENTS:

To enable everyone to enjoy the view from all areas of the motorcoach and provide the opportunity of getting acquainted with all of the passengers, seating will be rotated on a regular basis. We rotate seats throughout the tour. If you have motion sickness we recommend you bring along something to manage it. Your tour director will explain the rotation procedure the first day of the tour.

INSPIRATIONAL MOMENTS:

Tour directors are permitted to share a moment of non-denominational inspiration with full cognizance of the divergence of beliefs of individual passengers.

PERSONAL IDENTIFICATIONS:

For all travel, domestic and foreign, photo I.D. should be carried. For travel by motorcoach into Canada or Mexico, U.S. citizens will need proof of citizenship, such as a valid passport. For all other foreign travel, a valid passport is required. Some countries also require a visa.

CHURCH:

When conditions on the tour allow, we encourage you to attend the church of your choice. However, we are unable to make any special provisions for anyone to attend church.

SPECIAL OCCASIONS:

If you will be having a special occasion such as a birthday or anniversary while we are on tour, please let us know in advance so that we may help you celebrate.

CLOTHING:

Summer weight casual clothing is recommended for most tours. Spring and fall tours or mountain and coastal climates may require slightly heavier clothing. We suggest comfortable walking shoes, jacket or sweater which could be stored in the overhead luggage rack when not in use, foldaway umbrella, and a bathing suit for hotel pools and jacuzzis.

PARKING:

Southwest Tour and Travel clients may leave their cars at our office at no charge. Southwest Tour and Travel accepts no liability for damage to your vehicle. If you are boarding the motorcoach at another location other than our travel office, you must obtain permission from that property.
